A paper copy of the full draft plan can also be viewed at Ringsend Library and Ringsend Irishtown Community Centre for a period of six weeks from Wednesday 18th January 2017 until close of business on Tuesday 28th February 2017. Following that the plan as amended will be brought to the South East Area Committee of Dublin City Council for adoption in 2017.

Inside this newsletter are just some highlights, I would urge everybody to view the full plan in Ringsend library.



The Study Area

The Study area focuses on the villages of Ringsend and Irishtown. They are neighbouring south-side inner Suburbs of Dublin located on the south bank of the River Liffey, on the periphery of the docklands area of the city. The River Dodder is situated to the west of the study area and approximately two kilometres east of the city centre. South Lotts and the Grand Canal Dock areas are located to the west and Sandymount to the south.



Library Plaza

The intention is to improve the surface areas in and around the library taking away the steps, improving the carriageway to slow down traffic as it moves through the village and add a glazed extension to the library to rejuvenate the west and north elevations of the library. By doing so, the library building will no longer turn its back to the retail units but they will begin to interact with one another and it will open up the plaza and allow for level access into the library and generate a much improved relationship with the square and adjacent buildings. The glazed area could potentially provide the venue for community use.
